Cllrs Woodfield and Williamson attended a briefing session at Lound which they found very helpful-received reference literature which will be of future use.

Cllr Woodfield advised that 2 quotes had been received for the works on the archaeological survey, which is likely to be broadened. These will be considered in July, with everyone involved optimistic work will commence in 2016

## **11. Any Other Business**

Notices regarding dog fouling had been displayed but were removed. These will be replaced, with further supplies available if needed.

Oak Tree in front of The Ferryboat in need of cutting back

Concern was expressed that users of the village hall who did not have either heating or hot water available during their activities or events were still being charged the full cost of hire, with no discount or partial refund being offered. Cllrs felt this could put some people off hiring the hall. In addition, concern was voiced firstly over the placement of the second cooker, which was possibly a health and safety hazard, and secondly the hot water urn, which has had a faulty thermostat reported, and should be either replaced or repaired as soon as possible. The Clerk was instructed to write to the Village Hall Committee raising the points above
